

Mission Statement

Our Mission statement was adopted in 2006. It reflects the vision of our founders incorporated in the first church creed written in the mid 1930's. The creed states: "We purport to be democratically Christian, believing that the democratic process is the most educative in the development of the personality...We purport to be a community church in fact--a community church is supra-racial and supra-national, open to all regardless of race, class or caste, and seeks to render real service to the community in light of its needs." Throughout its history, CCH has been generous in its support of the less fortunate, helping to feed the hungry through the River of Life and can goods for the Food Bank. Our Sewing Circle has made blankets for the homeless and wounded veterans. Our Youth participate in the Annual Souper Bowl of Caring, and sell Fair Trade coffee and candy. CCH has been a long term supporter of the Palolo Chinese Home--Eldercare Services, and the wider church throughout the five voluntary offerings of the United Church of Christ.
